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The Book of Mormon Tabbing and Marking Guide To The General Tabbing Guidelines always place the tab on the left side of the page, even when Scripture is on the right side. The style of marking is a personal choice. You can frame the entire scripture passage or only highlight the number of verses. Labels can be removed and change position if you do so very carefully. Over time, the labels will be permanent. If a scripture passage requires a page to turn, point it at the bottom of the last passage on the first page. Would you or your family like help? As a missionary, I have studied it in detail many times and noted it many times. After my mission, I did what blue copies of the Book of Mormon did while in college. However, it seemed with the children, I was only able to read, but did not really learn. I need something that will help me focus as I read. A system that would help me look for key points and doctrines. So what to do when you want to create such a labeling system? I certainly headed to Pinterest to see if there was anything already available, and I also went back to my old Book of Mormon to see what I had done in them. I made a few lists of things I wanted and themes that I wanted and made a marking system for myself. That being said, it's not an ideal system yet. ☺ you can see in the picture that I've added and edited some of my topics as I studied. I made these changes to the press. First, before I get into how I actually celebrate my scriptures, I'd like to share with you my favorite labeling tools. I love Pentel Arts 8 mechanical pencil. I love having so many color marking options in one pencil. It's kind of an expensive purchase, but you'll use it loads. Although pentel Art 8 comes with red, I still love my marker WRITING LDS pencil. If they did it in all the colors of the rainbow, this is what I would use. I also use these 1/4 transparent Mark-It scripture tab points. They also have opaque, but I prefer transparent. My favorite pens for signing scriptures and marking on Sakura Pygma Micron. I use colored to emphasize actual scriptures and black 01 and 03 to write in the margins. They are perfect for tiny writing and they don't bleed pages of your Book of Mormon. I also had great luck with these sticks from Michael. They are from the memories of the thin collection of the liner. They don't bleed through my pages of the Book of Mormon like some other fine line handles do. Here are the steps for how I dream of the scriptures according to the system: I emphasize the scriptures or part of the scriptures with the color of Pigma Micron, which is coordinated with a particular topic. I use an old bus pass from my mission to make straight lines, but you could use a ruler or an old key to the hotel. For this verse, it is about the Atonement, which is blue. I use a Pentel pencil to emphasize the scriptures in a color that fits the broader theme. With my system, the Atonement fall into the Plan of Salvation category, which is green. Finally, I book a note on the scriptures by making a tap with Mark-It dots. My dot color and my highlight colormatch each other. I have drawn lines on the sides of my scriptures that line up with themes, so that tabs can be lined up with a theme, making it very easy to find Scripture on the topic. I've edited my original labeling guide to meet some of the changes I needed while studying, and I'll offer it to you as a free download when you sign up for my newsletter. I also made an empty that you can customize for your specific study. I printed my white paper stickers to make it easy to stick inside the front bay of my scriptures. - By marking my Scriptures year after year my students express disappointment in how to read and understand how to read and understand. So it was a relentless challenge for me to try to come up with effective ways to help them understand what they are reading and then apply it to their individual lives. So here's one method. Simply put, here is a scripture-labeling package for 1 Nephi in the Book of Mormon. By no means do I expect to hit every important principle in this book here. Are you joking. This was simply intended to 1) Help them better understand what they are reading, 2) Teach them new ways to mark their scriptures (except for a simple coloring in the entire verse) and 3) allowing them to move forward from there. Those who are familiar with the tools of their trade and use them properly are on track to become masters. Masters. who do the same with the scriptures are on the road to understanding the gospel. Marking the scriptures is the most useful way to use some of the biblical tools that God has given us. Share the following advice to Elder Boyd K. Packer, a member of the Twelve Apostles, regarding the signing of the scriptures: There are a number of plans for the signing of the scriptures. They are somewhat different and should correspond to the person. It is important to emphasize them and make marginal notes of some kind so you can find them again. I almost never read a borrowed book. I don't like reading borrowed books because I don't want to read books without overshadowing things I want to remember. Since no one emphasizes someone else's book, I feel that if a book is worth reading, it is worth owning. The exception, of course, is in the library, and it requires a longer process of taking notes. So emphasize your books and take your notes while you think about it. I don't know how many hours I spent trying to find something I could find very quickly if I regularly followed this procedure. Now I'm doing much better than I used to (Teach Ye Diligently, 166). Ask students to suggest reasons why it is important for them to celebrate their scriptures. Developing a list of scriptures can be an effective learning method. Choose one or more of the following examples to consider in the classroom and create a list of scriptures for each of them: Previous examples are lists with all the elements located in the same area of the scriptures. There are two other types of lists. One is a scattered list, that is, the items are not all in one place. Examples include signs of time and signs of a true church. The second type of scripture list is an implied list. For example, please note that in Ephesians 5:23-28, the Apostle Paul gave his moving advice that the relationship between Christ and the Church should serve as a model for the relationship between husband and wife.
